- 20% work downtown
- 90% are SU/ ESF /Upstate Medical faculty, staff or graduate students

2017 Highlights and Accomplishments

Community Building: UNPA hosted the Fourth Annual Fun Run with over 200 children participating; and 4 community Pot Lucks with over 150 neighbors at each. Cultivating partnerships, like the one with the Barry Park Association, in our neighborhood is vital to community building. Our neighborhood is dynamic and forward-thinking and UNPA's flexible approach to community building remains at the core of our mission.

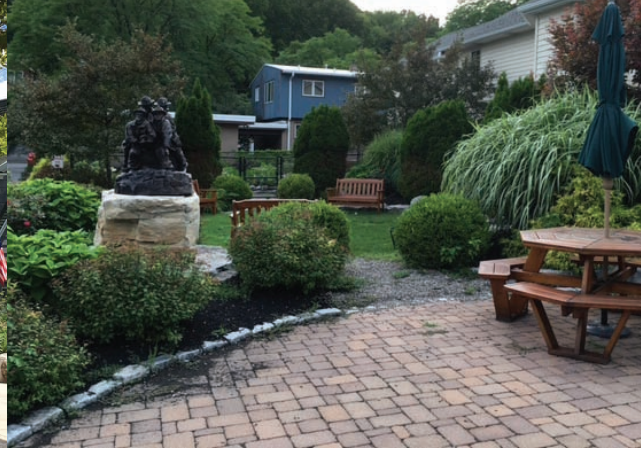
Facilitating Home-Ownership: UNPA's **Homebuyers Assistance Grant Program** & **1% Loan Program** provide funds to maintain housing stock, increase home values and leverage funds to meet the needs of today's homeowners. The homebuyer's grant is used for interior & exterior improvements & UNPA's loan program, administered by Home Headquarters, now allows loans for both interior and exterior improvements; up to \$10,000 at only 1%!

There is a strong desire to purchase owner-occupied homes in the University Neighborhood. This year we continued to see homeowners seeking affordable, move-in condition properties that will hold their value and allow homeowners to be close to downtown while being part of a vibrant community. Our programs strive to meet those needs.

Preserving Housing Stock: UNPA has taken ownership of the Gustav Stickley House at 438 Columbus Avenue and will manage exterior renovations, foundation and roof repair. The Craftsman interior, the first of its kind in the United States, will be restored. UNPA has also received \$7,500 from the National Trust for Historic Preservation to support the project and expects additional grant support as well. The Gustav Stickley House Foundation has been formed to raise funds to complete the remaining phases of the project to complete the restoration.

UNPA also provides assistance for properties of particular need. Know of a property in need? Contact us. UNPA helps owner-occupants purchase one, two or multiple unit properties for owner occupancy. Also, together with neighbors and property owners on a single block, or more, UNPA can help leverage its resources to match neighbor investment to attract owner-occupants to homes at risk of becoming rentals.

The University Neighborhood Preservation Association (UNPA) is a not-for-profit housing organization founded in 1991. Our mission is to maintain owner occupancy in the University Neighborhood, and to promote the Neighborhood as a great place to live. For more than 25 years, UNPA has assisted more than 825 homebuyers with more than \$3 million in grants and loans. \$95,000 in last year alone!
